You are invited to participate in an evening book study as we celebrate our life together as a community of faith at the Church of the Ascension.

"LIFE TOGETHER" by Dietrich Bonhoeffer

While Dietrich Bonhoeffer's life was cut tragically short at the age of 39 when he was executed by the Nazis in April 1945, he remains one of the most influential theologians and pastors of the twentieth century. His meditation on Christian community – entitled *Life Together* – remains a relevant description of what it means to be a Christian and how Christians are called by God to live in a community that is shaped by the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

As part of our preparation for the parish's 60th anniversary, a group of parishioners will be reading and discussing Bonhoeffer's *Life Together* in September and October, led by Fr. Bob Derrenbacker. Fr. Bob will be introducing the book to the church at both services during the sermon time on September 14. What will follow will be four Sunday evening study sessions at the Rev. Anne's home at 7:00 p.m. – September 28, October 5, 19, and 26.

Reflection from the Primates World Relief and Development Fund

Week of August 17 (Pentecost 10)

Reading: Genesis 45:1-15 Then Joseph said to his brothers "Come closer to me." And they came closer. He said, "I am your brother, Joseph, whom you sold into Egypt. And now do not be distressed, or angry with yourselves, because you sold me here; for God sent me before you to preserve life. For the famine has been in the land these two years; and there are five more years in which there will be neither plowing nor harvest. God sent me before you to preserve for you a remnant on earth, and to keep alive for you many survivors. So it was not you who sent me here, but God; he has made me a father to Pharaoh, and lord of all his house and ruler over all the land of Egypt. Hurry and go up to my father and say to him, 'Thus says your son Joseph, God has made me lord of all Egypt; come down to me, do not delay. You shall settle in the land of Goshen, and you shall be near me, you and your children and your children's children, as well as your flocks, your herds, and all that you have. I will provide for you there—since there are five more years of famine to come—so that you and your household, and all that you have, will not come to poverty.'

PWRDF Partner Story: Responding to the Horn of Africa Drought by Simon Chambers, PWRDF Communications Coordinator. This article first appeared on the PWRDF website on July 31, 2011.

Editor's Note: In the summer of 2011, millions of people in eastern Africa were affected by a major drought that led to famine in some regions. PWRDF was part of the global response to the drought that year.

Thousands of people fleeing Somalia for desperately overcrowded refugee camp in Dadaab, Kenya. Livestock dead. No water, the soil turned to dust. 10.7 million people affected. The numbers are staggering, and the images are horrifying. This is the reality for so many people living in the Horn of Africa as the drought in the region continues, and the UN declares a famine in Somalia.

3.7 million people are affected by the famine in southern Somalia alone – fully half the population of that nation. "We are already underway in our efforts to distribute 262 tonnes of flour and 52 tonnes of cooking oil to the hardest-hit areas of Gedo province in Somalia. This first delivery will assist over 30,000 people in four villages for around a month," said Gaim Kebreab, representing the ACT Alliance in Somalia and Kenya.

PWRDF is working in Kenya through the Anglican Church of Kenya and the Canadian Foodgrains Bank. Food is being purchased from local farmers and distributed to those in need, including refugees at the Dadaab refugee camp, which now houses more than four times the 90,000 people it was built to house. Purchasing food locally is an important part of responding to disasters, as it puts money into the local economy, and saves the time and expense of shipping food around the world.

Finally, PWRDF is responding in Ethiopia through ACT, the global, ecumenical... of which PWRDF is a member. ACT is helping over 68,000 people in Ethiopia by providing food, health care, drought preparation training for farmers, and "food for work" projects which will help to plant trees, prevent soil erosion, and construct roads in the region.

Sunday morning: Holy Eucharist at 9am and 11am. Sunday school takes place at the 11am service and there is also a nursery for babies and toddlers.


Wednesday morning: Holy Eucharist at 9:30am followed by Bible Study. All welcome!
