News from Primate's World Relief and Development Fund

Our Primate ++Fred Says......

"For many students in Haiti, the hot lunch provided by PWRDF at their school is the only food they will have that day. In fact, in many cases, it's the reason they attend school at all. If lunch wasn't provided, the children would be at home, helping their families to try to have enough food to eat. Instead, they are able to go to school and learn, an action that helps them improve their own lives.

"Some like it Hot," says +Fred in his latest statement for the Fred Says food security campaign. "Let's remember the children in Haiti, for whom a hot lunch is not just something they'd like, but something they absolutely need."

Students receive a lunch of rice and beans, supplemented with vegetables either grown at the school or purchased locally. On market days, some fish might also be added to the meal. Students report that they are able to focus on their studies when they aren't concentrating on the ache in their empty bellies. As a result of the program, enrollment is up, as are success rates for the students."
