

### THORNELOE LECTURE:

Beyond the "Evolution" vs. "Creation" Debate Laurentian University, October 24, 2014, 7:30 PM

Philosophers and geneticists tell us that in our beginnings we find clues to our end. Genesis is a book of beginnings, and from time immemorial, Jews and Christians have returned to this book to help them in understanding life's meaning and purpose in the plan of God. This foursession exploration of Genesis will touch on the themes of creation, Sabbath, disobedience and judgement, marriage and family, and the problem of evil. These are fitting themes to reflect on as we prepare ourselves to behold the end of all things in the Advent of Christ.

The discussion will not assume prior biblical knowledge among the participants, apart from having read the text before the sessions.
