Mary Sherwood is a Canadian Missionary who felt called by God to assist with the establishment of an orphanage in Madagascar. This happened in 1997 after several years of ground work. Mary was ably assisted and the Mother's Union in Madagascar. The orphanage is called Akany Famonjena and today is home to 36 Malagasy children. Those who work at the orphanage are also reaching out to many needy children and young women in the surrounding area where poverty has robbed them of
