Missionary visitor on October 19th

Mary Sherwood is a Canadian Missionary who felt called by God to assist with the establishment of an orphanage in Madagascar. This happened in 1997 after several years of ground work. Mary was ably assisted and the Mother's Union in Madagascar. The orphanage is called Akany Famonjena and today is home to 36 Malagasy children. Those who work at the orphanage are also reaching out to many needy children and young women in the surrounding area where poverty has robbed them of health, education and hope, and where an active Christian witness is needed. They have a new home, The Akany Tafita Centre, where 60 children are taught, fed and cared for during the daytime. Mary has been travelling across our diocese to tell the story of her homes and the special needs of the children for years. She travels yearly between Canada and Madagascar. Mary will be visiting us on October 19th and speaking at both services that day during the sermon time. There will be a freewill offering for Mary's missionary work, and we ask you to give generously. More information about Mary's work will be posted on the our church's website and facebook.
