Outreach opportunities for the month of November.

There are tremendous needs in our community and beyond. Please help with one or more of the following good causes, as you are able:

- 1. On November 19th the Ascension will be providing a healthy lunch for the students at Barrydowne College. This is part of the ecumenical communities commitment to doing this once a month for the school year.
- Our date is Wednesday 19 th November and we hope that you will consider being part of this outreach. We need the items that you are donating for the lunch at the church by 9 am so they can be taken to the school for lunchtime. In order to help you to choose and remember what you have selected Jane Cox has prepared a number of 'tags' with lunchtime suggestions on them. You will find these on a table at the back of the church. Thank you for caring about healthy lunches for students trying to get their high school diplomas.
- 2. For 15 years Ascension parishioners have been packing shoeboxes at Christmas time for Operation Christmas Child. It's a simple idea that has grown over the years. You take a shoebox from the entrance of the church and a flyer that explains how to pack it for a child ranging in age from birth to 14. You decide the age range. Then you find small gift items to pack into the box and return it to the church today so that your Christmas gift to a child in a developing world gets there by Christmas. Don't forget to include \$5 for postage.
- 3. There is a fundraising concert for the Elgin Street Mission on Friday 21 st November at 7 pm at Glad Tidings Church. The Mission has been a vital part of our community for 25 years and receives no funding from the government. It is up to us to helps this less fortunate than ourselves. Tickets are \$10 each.
- 4. Today there is a fundraising concert "Opera for a Cause" at St. Andrews Place. This fundraiser will support the Infant Food Bank and the Sudbury Soup Kitchen. There are two concerts one at 2 pm and one at 7 pm and tickets are \$20 each. See Rev. Anne for tickets.

Wednesday morning: Holy Eucharist at 9:30am followed by Bible Study. All welcome!


We have a team of parishioners who are licensed by the Bishop to bring the Reserved Sacrament to individuals or couples who are unable to make it to church on Sunday mornings.
