Camp Manitou is a residential camp that fronts the North Channel of Lake Huron, 12 kilometres west of the town of Whitefish Falls. With the La Cloche Mountains as a backdrop, the setting is rustic, yet

Leaders and youth and families have been sharing summer experiences there since the 1920s. Programs take place in a friendly atmosphere and include camp fires, swimming, hiking, kayaking, canoeing, crafts and much, much more. Skilled and screened volunteers provide leadership for youth and family camps.

The Camp season is as follows:

Youth Camps are \$280 per week. Bursaries are available from a number of sources.

Girls Camp ages 12 and up: July 4th - July 11th Girls camp ages 8-11: July 11th to July 18th

Boys camp ages 8-11: July 18th - July 25th Boys Camp ages 12 and up: July 25th - August 1st

Leadership Training: Boys 14-16 July 18th - August 1st.

Nature camp: August 1st - August 8th (for families, individuals who love nature Maximum of \$830 per family for the week)

Family Camp 1: August 8th - August 15th (\$270 per adult; \$145 for youth under 16; Max of \$830 per family)

Family Camp 2: August 15th - August 22nd Family Camp 3: August 22nd - August 29th.

Exploring a Lenten Desert

Looking for another way to live Lent? "Exploring a Lenten Desert" is a six-session course that introduces participants to the desert as an image of spiritual dryness and refreshment and to the tradition of contemplative prayer that emerged from the practices of a fascinating group of 4th century men and women who fled the cities to seek closer relationship with God in the Egyptian desert. We will explore their pithy and paradoxical wisdom as we learn about (and practice) a variety of forms of contemplative prayer, including using psalms as

prayer, awareness reflection, Ignatian imaginative prayer, centring prayer, lectio divina, and shared silence. If you've never heard of these, it's ok—that's part of the exploration! We will meet on Mondays through Lent, starting on February 23, from 7 to 9 p.m. at the Church of the Epiphany (85 Larch St.). Altar Guild


