Diocese of Algoma Youth Synod

Synod and happens from Sunday June 28th - Wednesday July 1st at beautiful Camp Manitou. The theme for this year's Synod is " Faith Unlimited" . Rededication of gifts from St. Mark's Garson

The Christus Rex Cross is given to the glory of God and in loving memory of Stephen Moorhouse, dear brother of Sue Bate. The cross is given by the Moorhouse and Bate families. May Stephen's soul rest in peace and rise again in glory.

The Christus Rex cross portrays a very different figure of Christ than the one we are used to seeing. If you look carefully at the figure of Christ you will notice that the crown of thorns is gone, as are the nails in his hands and feet. Christ is now robed in the royal clothes of a king - our king. Yet we remember that Christ's kingdom is not of this world, and that we are called to live in Christ's kingdom in a way that is giving, serving others and loving, as Christ loved us.




Mr Joe Lee (Snr.) carved the letters of The Lord's Prayer on this wooden tablet when he returned from work in the evenings. This wall hanging first hung at the Church of the Good Shepherd on Skead Rd. and when it closed down it was taken to St. Marks Church in Garson.

The purple and white woven wall hangings are given to the glory of God and in loving memory of Tom Armstrong, dear father of Sandra Paquette, by the Paquette family. May Tom's soul rest in peace and rise again in glory.

These two wall hangings once hung at the front of St. Mark's in Garson. They will now find a new home in our chapel space where they will remain permanently. Purple is the colour of penitence or royalty and white the colour of celebration and thanksgiving.

The silver breadbox originated at the Church of the Resurrection. When it closed, it found a new home at St. Mark's Garson. It was given by members of the Altar Guild. We give thanks for the faithful ministry of members of the altar guild for so many years - at the Church of the Resurrection, St. Mark's and the Church of the Ascension.

At the Board meeting this week.....

We talked about #22 Days and how the members of the Ascension will participate in the countdown to the ending of the TRC on June 21st. There will be a presentation on the TRC at the Ascension by Prof. Brock Pitawanakwat on Tuesday June 23rd at 6:30pm.

We heard stories of the wonderful work that is being done by the Monarch recovery services for those in treatment for alcohol or drug addiction. We voted to fund a telephone line for one year for Monarch recovery services from Outreach funds.

We gave \$200 to PWRDF for the work being done in Nepal following two earthquakes in the last six weeks. This gift comes from the Outreach Fund.

Thank you for your generous Christmas donations which helped fund these two worthwhile causes.

We had a conversation about the role of young people in the church and voted to license Maggie Leigh and Pippa Howard as Eucharistic assistants.

We gave thanks for the success of the Senior's lunch and for those who helped with this event.

We voted to purchase a shed for the back

yard in which the new BBQ and other garden items will be stored. We were given a presentation on new photocopier options, and voted to lease a new photocopier which will have wifi connection from the office and the ability to fold, staple and collate documents. The existing copier will be given to St. Alban the Martyr Church in Capreol.

We heard from Matt Walchuk on this year's Out of the Cold dinners in downtown Sudbury. This year the five teams served a total of 4292 meals on Friday evenings.
