This week our church and rectory had its annual inspection by the deanery officials - Rev. Doug Prebble, Gilles Tessier and Tom Linck. They spent three hours with the wardens and myself and concluded that we have a beautiful facility and are taking excellent care of it. All of our books and registers are in order too, and we were very pleased with the visit.

However, they determined that there is some work to be done over at the rectory (1162 Rinfret Street), which we rent out to a tenant. There are trees which are in danger of falling down, and with leaks into the basement, the front part of the rectory needs to be dug up and have repairs done to the weeping tiles. There is plenty of
