Advent Service of Lessons and Carols

With a Deanery wide choir of 27 people, one of the most anticipated events of the Anglican church year, the Advent service of Lessons and Carols will be presented at the Church of the Epiphany Wednesday December 16 at 7:00 pm and on Sunday December 20th at 10:30 a.m. by a choir composed of singers of the Sudbury-Manitoulin area. This Advent service had its inception in a service first prepared for Christmas eve in Truro, England in 1880, which has become part of Christmas celebrations around the world. The BBC annually broadcasts the service from King's College, Cambridge, a tradition begun in 1928. In 1934 a service of lessons and selected carols, from medieval to contemporary, was adapted to celebrate the Advent season of hope, and has become a muchloved tradition marking the preparation for Christmas.

Wednesday morning: Holy Eucharist at 9:30am followed by Bible Study. All welcome!


We have a team of parishioners who are licensed by the Bishop to bring the Reserved Sacrament to individuals or couples who are unable to make it to church on Sunday mornings.
