Becoming the Story We Tell

In his column in the December edition of the Algoma Anglican, Bishop Stephen expressed his deep conviction that "our Church will discover untapped resources when we become what we believe we are." Therefore, as follow up on the fall's successful "Lift Up Your Hearts" initiative, he encouraged us to go "deeper into our discipleship" by using a resource called "Becoming the Story We Tell."

"Becoming the Story We Tell" is a resource developed for the Anglican Church of Canada, at the Primate's request, for use in Lent and Easter. It draws on the lectionary, the baptismal covenant, and our authorized liturgical rites, and it can be easily adapted to your congregation needs.

Gatherings are being held throughout the Diocese in January for a one-day deep-dive into this material.

The gathering for the Deanery of Sudbury/ Manitoulin will be held on January 19th from 10am to 4pm. Everyone is welcome to attend this day long event. Please let Rev. Anne know if you plan on attending.

Getting to know our neighbours

As we continue to build relationships with our Indigenous neighbours, please join us for our next gathering on January 27 at 6:30 pm.

Ghislaine Goudreau, a health promoter with the Sudbury Health Unit, will talk to us about traditional roles of Indigenous women, healing and the power of the drum.

Ghislaine is a health promoter with the Sudbury and District Health Unit and has developed programs that focus on improving the health of Aboriginal women, such as a cross cultural anti-violence program. She developed the Anishnaabe-Kwe (Aboriginal Women) Water Journey program. Despite challenges Ghislaine completed her Master's of Science degree from the University of Alberta with her thesis, "Exploring the connection between Aboriginal women's hand drumming and health promotion (Mino Bimaadiziwin). Her research process served to empower the participants and they explored the physical, mental, emotional, spiritual, cultural and social supports integral to Aboriginal women's hand drumming. She is definitely an inspiration and a role model for other young First Nations Women.

Bishop Damphousse Reception

An event of ecumenical interest is the January 20, 2016 Sudbury reception of the Most Rev. Marcel Damphousse, the newly appointed Roman Catholic Bishop of Sault Ste. Marie. He replaces Bishop Jean-Louis Plouffe who retires after almost 29 years of ministry.

Bishop Damphousse will be welcomed as the Catholic Bishop of Sault Ste. Marie to the Sudbury Community on Wednesday 20th January. There will be a service at St. Anne Des Pins church at 7pm. All welcome!
