Please continue to hold them prayer while they prepare to travel to Canada, during their journey and once they arrive in their new community. Below are nine prayers, thoughtfully composed by Jen and Jane of the ARK Committee, we can include in our daily prayers.

We pray that Manar and her family will be embraced

with love, understanding, and patience by the community of Greater Sudbury.

We pray for the kids' teachers who have large and important tasks.

We pray for all volunteers that help resettle our Syrian family.

We pray that they will be respectful of cultural differences, patient when things go awry, and recognize the richness of these new relationships.

We pray to God that the volunteers will allow resettlement to flow and not rush our family according to the volunteers' views/ expectations.

We also pray that our volunteers remain well balanced and healthy in their own personal lives.

We have seen several other sponsoring groups struggle with 'burn out' of their volunteers. God made us all different.

We pray for tolerance. We pray for travel mercies. Our family made up of a single, Muslim woman with 4 young children has never flown in an airplane, nor had connections to navigate.

We have been asked to "Welcome the stranger" in Mathew's Gospel. Please Lord, let us honour this request in light of our Syrian family.

We pray for the volunteers—that they will be patient with themselves and their team members as they help to resettle our Syrian family.
