

Voting criteria: All persons shall be entitled to a seat and a vote when they are Baptized, are full 16 years of age, are habitual attendees at divine worship, Have contributed in the year immediately prior to the working expenses of the church.

Our agenda includes:

- -the election of People's and Deputy wardens
- -the election of 2 Synod delegates and 2 alternate delegates. Synod, our bi-annual Diocesan meeting which gathers representatives from across our Diocese, occurs May 3-6, 2017 in Sault Ste Marie. As a delegate you are required to attend monthly church board meetings and Deanery Council meetings that are held twice a year. Synod delegates must be 16 years of age or older, baptised, regular attendees at worship and have contributed to the ongoing expenses of the church in the year prior.
- -nomination of members-at-large. The Board is open to interested members of the parish. It requires attendance to monthly meetings (we ask you not to miss more than three a year) and participation in one or two of our committees. There is a cap of 10 members-at-large. If more than 10 individuals are nominated, there will be an election.
- -a motion on a Memorial Donation policy (you will find a copy of this in the Annual Vestry Booklet).
- -discussion of the concurrence process.

Anyone who wants to be on the board or to be considered for one of the elected positions needs a nominator.

Our committees are Worship, Parish Life and Outreach, Property, Pastoral Care/Visiting, Finance, Altar Guild, Anglican Church Women, Child and Youth Ministry, and Indigenous activities. If any of these committees interest you, you are welcome at any time of the year to become a committee member. You do not need to be on the Board to be on a committee.

BISHOP-ELECT ANNE'S CONSECRATION

UPDATE: Archbishop Colin Johnson, Metropolitan of Ontario, will preside at the Consecration of Anne Germond as Bishop of Algoma on Saturday, February 11th at St. Luke's Cathedral, 160 Brock St., Sault Ste. Marie. The Primate of Canada, the Rt. Rev. Fred Hiltz will be in attendance, as will members of the Ontario House of Bishops, and Bishops from the Catholic and Lutheran churches. Bishop Brian Germond, the retired Bishop of Johannesburg will be the guest preacher. The service begins at 9:30 am so if you plan to attend you must be early to get a seat. A reception will follow the service at Grand Gardens, 68 Dennis Street, Sault Ste. Marie. Ecumenical guests will offer a word of welcome to the new Bishop of Algoma during the reception.

The Consecration SERVICE will be live-streamed to a YouTube link from St. Luke's Cathedral. Further details regarding accessing this link will be provided at a later date. Joanie Servent will be at the Ascension on February 11th to set up the live stream link in the Fellowship Hall for those parishioners wishing to watch it from Sudbury.
