From Bishop Anne...

Dear Ascension friends,

Greetings from Niagara Falls where I am attending my first National House of Bishops meeting with colleagues from across the Anglican Church of Canada. There is so much to learn about the role and office of Bishop and so far everyone has been very helpful. This evening we went out for dinner with the bishops from our Provincial houses and I must say that the Ontario bishops are fun to be with. There are seven dioceses in Ontario - Algoma, Ontario, Huron, Toronto, Niagara, Moosonee and Otta-



wa. Toronto has a Diocesan bishop and four suffragan bishops so when we are together there are 11 of us in this house.

As you can imagine the first few months in 'office' have been a very steep learning curve for me. I feel very supported by the Synod office staff but I haven't got used to NOT preparing a bulletin or for the weekly Bible study. Each day is very different for me as I meet with clergy or wardens or make plans for upcoming gatherings such as next week's Synod. I've already visited eight parishes on Sunday mornings and had my very first Confirmation service and Baptism as a Bishop. That was in Capreol and it was very special indeed as Fr. Doug was at the Ascension for many years before being ordained.

You are often in my thoughts and prayers in this interim time. I am so grateful for the




mittee. It's a tremendous experience and opportunity to be part of a concurrence committee and to have a role to play in selecting a new incumbent for a parish. The Ascension is a very vibrant and diverse congregation and so there should be a good representation of your faith community on the committee.

An Update from ARK Committee

As it is April and spring has arrived, this seemed the appropriate time to write our many donors and volunteers with news of our Syrian mother (Manar) and her family. Since our last correspondence In late January, we at ARK imagine you may be wondering when the family is arriving, how are they doing and is there any work that needs to be done.

ARK members would like to share with you that while 'our family' is 'still not here', we continue to work to support Manar and her

children. We have been doing so in a number of ways. For example, thanks to technology and the generosity of our translator, we have been able to 'skype' with them in Lebanon every two to three weeks. Through these phone calls we have learned a great deal and are gradually developing a friendship with Manar and her four beautiful children. The phone calls have helped the family feel connected to Sudbury. They are learning about winter in Sudbury and we are learning about their day to day life, and about some of Manar's hopes for her family's future. The phone calls represent the beginning of a new life for Manar and we do our best to offer her some hope and support. We have been able to communicate with her that we continue to monitor her file from our end through conversations and emails with our Member of Parliament, and with the CIC office in Winnipeg.

Through our phone calls with Manar, we have been assured that she and her children are fine; they are safe and they aren't hungry. The United Nations sends them a food voucher each month. Manar tells us she receives the voucher 'by text'. There is no room for extras but their basic needs are being taken care of. Manar believes and hopes, she will continue to receive this support from the UN but it is never 100% certain. There are always a few days of worry before the text comes.

In December it was indicated that our family might arrive in February. As you may recall, the Lougheed's have generously donated a home to our Syrian family. Despite the delays, they have agreed to continue to make the home available for one more year. We have been fortunate as the Lougheed's are not asking for any financial remuneration until the family arrives. As a result, our donated funds remain intact in the bank account awaiting our family's arrival.

In addition to the above news, ARK members thought you would want to know that amidst these challenging and often confusing times that 'our family' is living through, Manar is making every attempt to provide her children with a normal life. They attend school in the afternoons and if she can find some transportation, she will bring her children to a playground which is a fifteen minute drive away. They have extended family close by and the family makes every effort to share in simple but heartwarming celebrations.

Finally, the ARK committee would like to leave you with your own 'To Do' list:

Please send your prayers to our Syrian family who are waiting in Lebanon for news that their file is complete; prayers for a safe time until they make it to Sudbury, prayers that we will all be able to help them settle in as comfortably as possible, and that we can help them feel like this will be a good place to call home.

From all of us on the ARK committee, thank you for your support and your continued patience, in this very long, and challenging wait.

Summer Worship

We are pleased to announce a summer exchange planned with the Church of the Epiphany. As is our tradition, starting on Sunday July 2nd, we move to one 10 a.m. Eucharist service. For the month of July, we are excited to host our Epiphany neighbours, as Epiphany gives their clergy leadership a summer break. In exchange, in August, the Epiphany will host the Ascension at their 9:30 a.m. Sunday Eucharist services so that our clergy can also have time off. The Ascension will offer Sunday Morning Prayer in August.

Both Anglican parishes are without an incumbent at this time. Bishop Tom Corston is serving as part-time interim clergy at the Epiphany. Our honorary clergy, Rev Bob, Rev Rhonda, and Rev Jeff have been providing us with Sunday Eucharist services since Bishop Anne's departure. Our clergy are also often filling in for other parishes in the region when the need arises. This being the case, we would like to support our clergy by giving them time off in the summer. In particular, it gives both parishes an opportunity to get to know each other as we share summer worship, and develop relationships as both parishes experience this time of transition without an incumbent. The Board agreed at our April meeting to endorse this plan.

St. Lydia's Dinner Church

St. Lydia's is a Lutheran congregation in Brooklyn, New York, that takes its name from the the pur-

ple seller in the Book of Acts who begs Paul and his companions to come and stay in her house. They celebrate the Eucharist at dinner, using a liturgy based on one from the Didache, a late first century collection of Christian writings. We did the same here, using the St. Lydia's liturgy, twice during Lent. Fr. Bob presided and Patti acted as deacon. We prepared the meal, sang, lit candles, blessed and broke the bread, ate together, heard and responded to Scripture, and blessed and shared the wine. Then we explored silence in our lives and in our prayer. For about twenty people between the two evenings it was both fun and a holy experience.



In the Footsteps of Martin Luther

For ten weeks through the winter, a hardy group met after the Wednesday morning service to honour the five hundredth anniversary of the Reformation by wrestling with passages from Scripture that were important to Martin Luther and the development of his doctrine of







justification by faith. These bold souls learned to chant psalms as if they were monks, respond to what they saw or felt about righteousness and judgment in the psalms by drawing, use lectio divina to meditate on passages from Romans and Galatians and think about justification, and make mind-maps to figure out grace. It was hard work using ways of doing Bible study that they hadn't tried before. They persevered, though, and capped it off by making models of their understanding of justification by faith out of Lego!




Good Friday Stations of the Cross

On Good Friday, a group of children and adults followed Jesus from his trial before Pilate to his tomb through seven interactive stations of the cross. At each station, they heard a passage from the Gospels, tried an activity that used one of their senses, did a prayer response, and made or collected an object to put in a box so that they could retell the story later. At the first station, Pilate washed his hands of having a role in Jesus' death, so the children used water to make a cross on their own hands, put a shiny blue stone in a bowl of water and said a prayer about a time when they did something they shouldn't have, and collected a piece of rope to remember

that Jesus was handed over to the guards. At the fifth station, they hammered nails into wood to hear the sound of the crucifixion, then hung wooden hearts on the big cross and prayed to have hearts of love, and put a nail into their boxes. At the last station, the tomb, the children drew symbols of Christ on strips of linen to put into the tomb and filled little bags with spices to put in their boxes and remind them of the grave spices used for Jesus' burial. It was interesting and engaging and made Good Friday just a bit more real for everyone. Many



thanks go to the volunteers who helped out on the day and extra thanks and kudos be-



long to Betty Cunningham, who worked with Patti to figure out what we might do and provided and organized the many craft materials we needed.


