From the Interim Rector...

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many.... If one member suffers, all suffer together with it; if one member is honored, all rejoice together with it." (1 Cor 12:12-14, 26 [NRSV])

Dear Ascensionites,

It's been nearly two months since my role at the Church of the Ascension changed from Honorary Associate to Interim Incumbent. Before, I didn't pay much attention to the (smooth) operations of the Parish; I was happy to preach, to celebrate the Eucharist when asked, and to lead the occasional book or Bible study. Things are different now – I'm sitting up and paying close attention, paying attention to how the Parish functions, all with a large cohort of dedicated volunteers who are dedicated followers of Jesus.

St. Paul's words to the Corinthians (printed above) come to my mind as I now have a new and fresh perspective of the Church of the Ascension as your Interim Rector. As a Parish, as a congregation of believers, we are "one body," irrespective of our back-grounds, ethnic heritages, social or educational statuses, age, at so on. As St. Paul writes: "For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body – Jews or Greeks, slaves or free..." He goes on to say that each of the members of the Body are different "body parts" (head, hand, eyes, etc.) and therefore play different but complementary roles to each other. This is something I've noticed acutely at the Church of the Ascension over the past two months. As a "Body," the Ascension has many different "body parts," each playing an important role in how the "Body" functions. For example, I officiated at a funeral in the church recently. There was little for me to worry about related

to this funeral as so many of the pieces just naturally came together – music, food, sanctuary paraments, greeters, readers, sides people, and so on. And these were all ministries done quietly and faithfully by so many of you. For me, this was a moment when the Church of the Ascension, as a body of believers, functioned so seamlessly and devotedly. You made me proud and thankful to God for the temporary ministry to which he has called me at this time.

So as we go into the lazy, hazy days of summer, let us not forget that each of us are members of the Body of Christ. Each and every one of us has an important ministry to live out here in the Body. And, in the words of St. Paul, "when one member suffers, may we all suffer together; and if one member is honored, may we all rejoice together."
